Primary Purpose of Position

- Responsible for the recruitment, training, development and oversight of team coaches.
- Develop the netball skills of players at all levels and capability with the goal of each individual achieving their potential in an enjoyable and supportive environment.
- Determines player allocation and team composition.

Key Responsibilities

- Provide oversight, support, training and development opportunities for coaches.
- Disseminate information to coaches regarding courses and seminars and provide coaching advice and support where possible.
- Foster the growth and raise the standards of the coaches.
- Encourage beginner coaches including players and parents to undertake formal coach education and or become accredited coaches.
- Liaise with the treasurer in formulating a budget anticipating cost of coaching.
- Be the first point of contact for conflict resolution for players and coaches.
- Allocate players to teams according to age and skill level with input from team coaches, taking into account the interests of the Club, team and finally player preferences.
- Manage team composition with respect to player numbers, spread of court positions.

 Be the first point of contact for parents who wish to raise issues in relation to coaching, team allocation, court position or game access, or other similar matters.
